## LILLY ENDOWMENT COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

The Carroll County Community Foundation is pleased to honor the recipient of the 2011 Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship. Thanks to the generosity of Lilly Endowment, one Carroll County student will receive full-tuition, required fees, and a special allocation of up to \$800 per year for required books and equipment for four years of undergraduate study at any Indiana public or private college or university. The 2011 recipient is **Ashley Gray**.

Ashley, daughter of Patricia Gray and Thomas Gray, is a graduate of Delphi Community High School. She is a member of the National Honor Society, Students Against Destructive Decisions (S.A.D.D.) Club, Key Club and Spanish Club. She is on the softball and volleyball teams.

In addition, she has received the Bob Blades Sportsmanship Award and Spanish Award. Ashley plans to attend Purdue University to study to become a physician's assistant.

This is the 14<sup>th</sup> year that the Endowment has funded the Lilly Endowment Community Scholars program for outstanding students in Indiana. The Community Foundation defined the criteria based on the Endowment's stated goal to "raise the level of educational attainment in Indiana." The criteria used in the selection process included: scholastic achievements, financial need, communication skills, essay, interview, and character.

There were 22 qualified and eligible Carroll County students who applied for the scholarship. A committee of volunteers evaluated the applications and selected the finalists who were interviewed by the Carroll County Community Foundation Board. The Carroll County Community Foundation has awarded approximately \$58,000 in scholarships for the 2011-12 school year, including the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship.

The **Carroll County Community Foundation Scholars** are the finalists in the competition for the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarships. The following are the recipients for 2011:

**Erika Matricia**, daughter of Gary and Kayuri Matricia, is a graduate of Delphi Community High School. She will be attending Purdue University in the fall to study pharmacy. **Margaret 'Shelby' Spray**, daughter of Don and Margie Spray, is a graduate of Carroll High School and will study psychology at the University of Southern Indiana. **Trexie Wolfs**, daughter of Nell Purdy and stepdaughter of Michael Purdy, is a graduate of Rossville High School. Trexie will attend Purdue University and her course of study is undecided at this time.

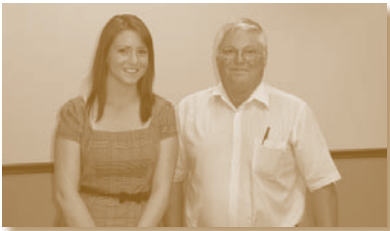
